

The Network Enterprise Center Leaders Course (NECLC), formerly known as the Director of Information Management (DOIM) Course, provides directors and key leaders the necessary training required to be more effective in providing the Warfighters Information Technology (IT) and customer service support with NEC operations. This course provides NEC Directors and related management fields updated technical training in areas of knowledge management and information dissemination management using collaboration scenarios; thus ensuring NEC Leaders are prepared for the complex, dynamic, and challenging mission of supporting Soldiers around the globe.

The NEC Leaders Course has a mixture of military and civilian personnel in attendance including directors, deputy directors, division chiefs, and Soldiers in the rank of SFC to LTC. During the course students receive briefings from senior level officials including BG Foley, U.S. Army Signal Center and Fort Gordon Commander, Army Chief of Information Office/CIO/G6, Network Enterprise Technology Command, 7<sup>th</sup> Signal Command, and non-military affiliated organizations. These briefings center on the vision of the Signal Regiment as well as provide valuable pointers on executive leadership. Students are also required to prepare a briefing of their organizational structure using the military briefing format.

Since its inception in May 2008, 221 military and civilian personnel have graduated the course via 18 resident classes and two Mobile Training Teams (MTT) classes. The course focuses on training, educating, and developing highly skilled information technology leaders who support the Warfighter during deployments, redeployments, and in garrison environments.
