In its infinite wisdom, the military developed a phonetic "alphabet" to eliminate errors in the information process. Basically, this phonetic system is a listing of words, with each word corresponding to its respective letter of the alphabet. The phonetic alphabet, which is listed here, is fairly simple and is an important aid for all communicators.



When you use this system, communicating is much easier. And when you consider how "elaborate" some of the Army's office symbols are, you can really appreciate the phonetic alphabet. Those B, D, E, T misunderstandings are clearly stated as Bravo, Delta, Echo, Tango. It's as simple as A, B, C — better make that Alpha, Bravo, Charlie.
